Summer Term 1	A Christmas Carol and Macbeth: revision of key events, characters and themes. Summer Term 2	Revision and exam preparation for internal exams. Spoken Language Assessment Preparation: analysing key speeches, discussing world issues, creating speeches and practicing speeches.	1 hour per week: booklet tasks, building on knowledge of current topics and retrieving skills from current and previous topics.
