Subject	What are students learning in lessons?	What could students do to extend their learning and develop their character?
Autumn Term 1	The Toyshop: storytelling through freeze frame and dialogue. Considering empathy and how we can be empathetic when telling a story.	Be curious: research what it was like for soldiers and nurses like William and Mary in World War 2.
Autumn Term 2	Mime: communicating using our bodies and faces, telling stories without the use of speech.	Be creative: mime a short scene of waiting for a bus when something exciting happens. Show family / carers. Can they recognise what is happening?
Spring Term 1	Commedia dell'arte: character and mask work. Looking at one of the oldest forms of theatre and how it has influenced modern theatre.	Be creative: design your own mask. What kind of character does it represent?
Spring Term 2	Kaliya: exploring stories from around the world and using drama techniques to help tell the story in an interesting way.	Be curious: discover an old story from another country, e.g. a Greek myth or an old folk tale. Share one with your adults at home.
Summer Term 1	Flat Stanley: taking on a character using body and voice, posture, gait, body language, facial expressions, tone and accent.	Be independent: visit a library and read one of the Flat Stanley books. What does he get up to?
Summer Term 2	Adverts and Persuasion: public speaking, being persuasive and convincing in speech.	Be creative; choose a household object and create an advert that persuades people to purchase your object.
