Subject	What are students learning in lessons?	What could students do to extend their learning and develop their character?
Autumn Term 1	Geographical Skills: location, latitude/longitude, grid references. Introduction to global climate: climate change causes and consequences.	Demonstrate service: create and implement small scale changes to your everyday life to reduce your carbon footprint.
Autumn Term 2	Development: how development is measured, inequalities, different types of aid.	Be independent: research a country looking at their social/economic development and the physical and human factors that cause it.
Spring Term 1	World of Water: water cycle, river features and landforms, and causes/impacts of flooding.	Be independent: research a famous river and create a fact file explaining why it is so important to the local people.
Spring Term 2	World of Water: water cycle, river features and landforms, and the causes and impacts of flooding. World of Work: types of industry, trade and tourism around the world.	Be curious: explore one career from each industry sector looking at the skills and qualifications you would need for the role.
Summer Term 1	World of Work: types of industry, trade and tourism around the world.	Be curious: explore where geography can take you in terms of a career. Research at least 3 different careers.
Summer Term 2	Revision and exam preparation for end of year exams. Fieldwork: planning, conducting and analysing an onsite fieldwork investigation.	Be curious: plan your own small scale fieldwork project. Present the idea to family / carers to see if you can bring the idea to life.
