Subject	What are students learning in lessons?	What could students do to extend their learning and develop their character?
Autumn Term 1	Rhythm, pulse and performance. Singing as part of a group and as a round. Basic Musical Notation.	Be curious: listen to a wide range of musical genres, including classical music by Mozart, Beethoven and Bach.
Autumn Term 2	Singing as an ensemble. Melody, pitch and patterns, basic keyboard skills. Notes of the treble clef and notes of the keyboard.	Be independent: revise the notes of the treble clef and rhythm durations including crotchet, quaver, minim, semi-breve.
Spring Term 1	Forms and devices. Major, minor and pentatonic scales. Binary form, ternary form and variations form. Key signatures up to 2 sharps or flats.	Be curious: listen to 'In the Hall of the Mountain King' by Grieg and Largo for the New World Symphony by Dvorak.
Spring Term 2	Introduction to Ableton. Composing a theme and variation. Keyboard skills. Unison and monophonic texture.	Be resilient: practice playing the keyboard with both hands in school practice rooms or at home.
Summer Term 1	Timbre and sonority. Instruments of the orchestra.	Be curious: listen to three different orchestral pieces of music. Which piece did you enjoy the most? Why?
Summer Term 2	Timbre and sonority. Instruments of the orchestra.	Be reflective: listen to three different orchestras play the same piece of music. What were the similarities and differences?
