Subject	What are students learning in lessons?	What could students do to extend their learning and develop their character?
Autumn Term 1	Blues: 12 bar Blues, walking bass lines, 7th chords.	Be curious: listen to some modern blues music. Do you have a favourite piece?
Autumn Term 2	Rhythms of the world: African drumming, Samba, Blues. polyrhythms, cyclic patterns.	Be curious: listen to some samba or bhangra music. Do you have a favourite piece?
Spring Term 1	Elements of music: rondo form, sonata form, notes of the bass clef, key signatures up to 3 sharps or flats.	Be determined: practice naming the notes of the bass clef until you can name them without needing to think about it.
Spring Term 2	Popular song writing. Use a digital audio workstation. Homophonic and polyphonic texture.	Be creative: write your own lyrics to the song you have written in class or one you have written at home.
Summer Term 1	Reggae: syncopation, performing as an ensemble, singing.	Be creative: write your own reggae song using the chords you have learnt in lessons.
Summer Term 2	Playing the guitar: performing as part of a group, learning chords and riffs.	Be curious: find out about different styles of guitar. What is the difference between a classical and electric guitar?
