Subject	What are students learning in lessons?	What could students do to extend their learning and develop their character?
Autumn Term 1	Impressionism: study Monet's painting techniques, develop different brushstroke skills and colour mixing.	Be curious: find out more about Impressionism. There are Monet works in The National Gallery.
Autumn Term 2	Impressionism: paint an Impressionist style painting from a photograph. Colour mixing and brushstroke techniques in the style of the Impressionists.	Be proactive: take photos you could use to paint from.
Spring Term 1	Cubist portraits: portraits from different angles. Study Cubism and develop a design for a collagraph print.	Be resilient: develop your skill by practising drawing portraits from different angles - use YouTube videos to help you.
Spring Term 2	Collagraph: create collagraph plate out of cardboard. Create a set of collagraph prints. Use different colour layers and explore which work best.	Be curious: research Cubism. You could look at Artwork in the Tate Britain or Tate Modern, or on their websites.
Summer Term 1	Real to Abstract - our school: draw the school building using line and perspective, inspired by Constructivism Art (simplification, abstraction and composition).	Develop your creativity: create abstract designs by simplifying lines from any drawing.
Summer Term 2	Abstract sculpture: design, refine and make. Share and adjust ideas working on a group sculpture. Learn building, cutting and joining skills. OR: Skills: focusing on drawing skills, colour and tin foil sculpture.	Be creative: make a sculpture out of found objects.
