Subject	What are students learning in lessons?	What could students do to extend their learning and develop their character?
Autumn Term 1	Festivals and Traditions: food and drink, festivals in French speaking countries, celebrations in the past and future.	Be open-minded: follow or create a recipe for a Francophone food and share with family or friends.
Autumn Term 2	The French speaking world: spotlight on a French speaking country and what you can do there, shopping in a Francophone country, now and before, comparing places to live in the world.	Demonstrate reflection: research and reflect on how Paris has changed since WW2. What can you do/see there now?
Spring Term 1	The World around us: environmental issues in a French speaking town, children's rights around the world, fair trade and volunteering.	Be independent: research the environmental impact of coffee production in Ivory Coast. Or find an eco-volunteering program in Madagascar you could join.
Spring Term 2	Revision of all units and exam preparation for end of year exams: relationships, festivals and traditions, the French speaking world and the world around us.	Be independent: revise all units from this year for your end of year exams.
Summer Term 1	Relationships: character descriptions and relationships, what makes a good friend and when you were younger.	Be creative: create a family tree for you or a friend with short descriptions of each family member in French.
Summer Term 2	Relationships: describing a photo, free time activities in the past and future, using present, past and future to describe weekend plans with friends and family.	Be creative: create captions in French for your own photos with family and friends. Describe the people in them and the activity.
