Subject	What are students learning in lessons?	What could students do to extend their learning and develop their character?
Autumn Term 1	Ensemble skills: playing in a band. Song structure, cadences, primary chords.	Be curious: listen to music from the 70s, 80s and 90s. How does it compare with music released today? Consider instruments and technical advances.
Autumn Term 2	Composition skills: melody and accompaniment texture, cadences and melody writing (including repetition and development.	Be curious: listen to a range of songs. Can you hear where the chord changes? Can you hear where the cadences are?
Spring Term 1	Intermediate Guitar skills and performing as an ensemble	Be curious: listen to a new genre of music. How does it compare to your favourite genre of music?
Spring Term 2	Film music: timbre, texture, fugue and sonata form, leitmotifs.	Be curious: listen for the sound effects and music within a film or TV program. How do they add to what is happening on screen?
Summer Term 1	Baroque to classical music: ornaments, exploring forms and devices, musical dictation.	Be curious: listen to some baroque and classical composers. Which is your favourite? Why?
Summer Term 2	Electronic music: how to use Ableton, repetition and contrast, build ups, drops, loops.	Be creative: listen to some remixes of popular songs. How and what have the remixes changed?
