Subject	What are students learning in lessons?	What are students learning in home learning?
Autumn Term 1	Religion and Life (theme B): the origins of humanity and the universe, the treatment of the natural world, the use and abuse of animals, abortion and euthanasia, the afterlife.	1 hour per week: tasks to retrieve and practise knowledge from previous learning.
Autumn Term 2	Christianity Beliefs: the nature of God, creation, the life of Jesus, sin and salvation, the afterlife.	1 hour per week: tasks to retrieve and practise knowledge from previous learning.
Spring Term 1	Religion, Crime and Punishment (theme E): types of crime and their causes, the aims of punishment, punishments including prison, community service and corporal punishment, capital punishment and forgiveness.	1 hour per week: revision and exam preparation for mid year exams.
Spring Term 2	Christianity Practices: prayer and worship, the church, pilgrimage, Christian Aid, reconciliation, persecution.	1 hour per week: revision and exam preparation for mid year exams.
Summer Term 1	Christianity Practices: prayer and worship, the church, pilgrimage, Christian Aid, reconciliation, persecution.	1 hour per week: revision and exam preparation for mid year exams.
Summer Term 2	Relationships and Families (Theme A): marriage, sex before and outside marriage, heterosexuality and homosexuality, contraception, polygamy, families, the role of men and women, gender equality.	1 hour per week: revision and exam preparation for end of year exams.
