Subject	What are students learning in lessons?	What could students do to extend their learning and develop their character?
Autumn Term 1	Non-Fiction: explore themes including power, poverty and family through a diverse range of writers, poets and non-fiction texts.	Be courageous: produce your own piece of non-fiction, poetry or creative writing based on this term's themes.
Autumn Term 2	Conflict and Love: explore powerful human emotions through poetry. Relationships and Identity: explore different perspectives through short stories.	Be curious: research the Romantic poets 1780 - 1830 create a comparison poster of Wordsworth, Blake, Shelley and Keats.
Spring Term 1	The Crucible: after preparing for their exams pupils will explore the concept of a Tragic Hero through themes such as guilt, justice and morality.	Be curious: explore The Salem Witch Trials and create a non-fiction article on witchcraft.
Spring Term 2	Complete The Crucible, then: Detective Fiction - Sherlock Holmes and The Speckled Band: characterisation and thematic exploration across the text.	Be curious: explore detective fiction and create a 'Top 10 Rules of Detective Fiction' poster using examples from Sherlock Holmes.
Summer Term 1	Romeo and Juliet: explore a Shakespearean Tragedy with a focus on key thematic links to power, love, relationships and conflict through the dramatic form.	Be focused: immerse yourself in the world of Shakespeare by watching a live or pre-recorded show. Write a theatre review.
Summer Term 2	Relationships and Identity Poetry Revisited: explore the poetic form focusing on key universal themes from across the academic year.	Be courageous: produce your own piece of non-fiction, poetry or creative writing based on the themes studied.
