### Reading (40 marks) (25%)

- one single text.
- 1 short form question (1 x 4 marks)
- 2 longer form questions (2 x 8 marks)
- 1 extended question (1 x 20 marks)

### Writing (40 marks) (25%)

 1 extended writing question (24 marks for content, 16 marks for technical accuracy) Paper 2: Writers'
 Viewpoints and
 Perspectives

### What's assessed

### Section A: Reading

 one non-fiction text and one literary non-fiction text

### Section B: Writing

 writing to present a viewpoint

### Assessed

- written exam: 1 hour 45 minutes
- 80 marks
- 50% of GCSE

### Questions

### Reading (40 marks) (25%)

- two linked texts
- 1 short form question (1 x 4 marks)
- 2 longer form questions (1 x 8, 1 x 12 marks)
- 1 extended question (1 x 16 marks)

### Writing (40 marks) (25%)

 1 extended writing question (24 marks for content, 16 marks for technical accuracy)

# Non-examination Assessment: Spoken Language

### What's assessed

(AO7-AO9)

- presenting
- responding to questions and feedback
- use of Standard English

### Assessed

- teacherset throughout course
- marked by teacher
- separate endorsement (0% weighting of GCSE)

## **ENGLISH LANGUAGE**

2 x 1 hour 45 minute papers:

Paper 1 one fiction extract descriptive/narrative writing

Paper 2 two non-fiction extracts persuasive/explanatory writing

On each paper, 50% of the marks are awarded for reading skills and 50% of the marks are awarded for writing skills.

### Assessments

All assessments are closed book; any stimulus materials required will be provided as part of the assessment.

All assessments are compulsory.

## Paper 1: Shakespeare and the 19th-century novel

### What's assessed

- Shakespeare
- The 19th-century novel

### How it's assessed

- written exam: 1 hour 45 minutes
- 64 marks
- 40% of GCSE

### Questions

Section A Shakespeare: students will answer one question on their play of choice. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the play and then to write about the play as a whole.

Section B The 19th-century novel: students will answer one question on their novel of choice. They will be required to write in detail about an extract from the novel and then to write about the novel as a whole.

### Paper 2: Modern texts and poetry

### What's assessed

- Modern texts
- Poetry
- Unseen poetry.

### How it's assessed

- written exam: 2 hour 15 minutes
- 96 marks
- 60% of GCSE

### Questions

Section A Modern texts: students will answer one essay question from a choice of two on their studied modern prose or drama text.

Section B Poetry: students will answer one comparative question on one named poem printed on the paper and one other poem from their chosen anthology cluster.

Section C Unseen poetry: Students will answer one question on one unseen poem and one question comparing this poem with a second unseen poem.
