I am writing to you ahead of your child's **'end of year' assessments,** which are scheduled to take place between June 16th and June 30th, 2025.

For many students, this will be the first time they have sat full examples of GCSE papers and so the results from these assessments will ensure students are in the right teaching groups to receive the correct level of guidance and challenge as they move into their final year at The Regis Schol.

Where do the assessments take place?



For the majority of students, the above assessments will take place in the Arena. Enabling students to sit their assessments in a formal exam venue supports them to build familiarity and confidence in the conditions that they will experience when sitting future formal assessments, including those at the end of Year 11.

What equipment will be needed for the assessments?

Students will need to ensure that they are fully equipped for their assessments. They should arrive with their standard school equipment which includes: 2 black ballpoint pens, a pencil, ruler, eraser, and a calculator. Students should also ensure they have spoken to their class teachers about any other equipment that may be required for specific subjects.

What can you do at home to help your child prepare for their assessments?

Please ensure your child is aware of when each assessment will be. Attendance to each assessment is compulsory to ensure your child has the opportunity to demonstrate their learning and receive feedback on their progress.

Students may need support in creating a comfortable and quiet space to work at home for revision. We encourage students to use a space free from distractions and to complete work without mobile phones or other distractions such as music or the television.

Class teachers will already be setting work on Arbor for students to complete ahead of their assessments. All work has been designed to support your child to achieve the best possible outcomes and so we ask that you check Arbor regularly and encourage your child to complete the revision set.

When will you be informed about your child's attainment and progress?

The results of all formal assessments will be shared with you via email/Arbor towards the end of the academic year. These reports will tell you the percentage scored in each assessment as well as your child's 'working at' grade, a good indication of how your child is working against GCSE requirements.
