## The Regis School: Sixth Form Dress Code

The Sixth Form at the Regis School is committed to raising aspirations and recognising achievement.

The Sixth Form will act as role models and as examples to the pupils in the school.

## The dress code will

- Foster respect for the Sixth Form from staff and other pupils
- Present an image that sets high expectations in the school and the community
- Should not distract from learning or be viewed as offensive, revealing or (sexually) provocative.
- Ensure that clothing is fit for purpose and have regard for Health and Safety.

## **Student Responsibility**

The Sixth Form need to be effective role models and recognise the important role they will play in the school. Students need to come to school ready to engage in their own learning and support the ethos of the school.

Examples of acceptable dress:	Examples of unacceptable dress:
Blouse/top – modest cut	Low cut or revealing clothing
Collared shirt T – shirts with sleeves	Crop tops Spaghetti strap tops
Dress (no shorter than mid thigh)	Ripped jeans
Trousers or Jeans Skirts (not shorter than mid thigh)	Shorts which are an inappropriate length or revealing
Shoes/boots/sandals/trainers	Flip flops
Shorts of an appropriate length	Inappropriate wording or images Beach wear
