




# Which University? Which Course?



### **Higher Education**

There are over 37,000 courses and 395 providers in the UK.

Many different routes available including:



Continue a current subject

Develop a personal interest

Start something completely new

## Research

There are a number of things applicants must consider when researching Universities, such as:

- Ensuring it is a subject they enjoy investing time, money, and effort.
- Do they have the correct entry grades, including GCSE's?
- Ensuring it is right for their **career path** check with employers and check graduate jobs.
- Location city/rural, transport links, accommodation, shops.
- Location- city vs campus? For example UCL vs Sussex.
- Location course? For example Nursing vs sport.
- Extra-curricular activities?
- Finances? Cost of living?



# Choosing the right course

#### How is the course taught?

- Most courses combine lectures, seminars, tutorials, and practicals. They should research this.
- They should think about their preferred learning styles structured teaching or more time completing research?
- How much group work will be done in seminars?
- How many lectures are there?
- Who are the tutors?
- What subject areas do tutors specialise in?

Universities use a whole range of assessment methods including exams, project work, presentations (individual or in groups), practical assessment, and dissertations.

# Key facts

- Application is entirely online.
- Maximum of five choices.
- Some choice restrictions:
  - medicine, veterinary science, dentistry (maximum of four)
  - Oxford or Cambridge
- Simple application cost:
  - Up to five choices £28.95 (\*Students in receipt of free school meals will have this fee waivered. They must include this on their application form and notify Mrs Potter.)



# When to apply?

•15 October 2025 for 2026 entry at 18:00 (UK time) – any course at the universities of Oxford and Cambridge, or for most courses in medicine, veterinary medicine/science, and dentistry. You can add choices with a different deadline later, but don't forget you can only have five choices in total.

•14 January 2026 for 2026 entry at 18:00 (UK time) – for the majority of courses.

Some course providers require additional admissions tests to be taken alongside the UCAS application, and these may have a deadline.



# When to apply?

Because they are applying through Sixth Form, they are strongly advised to follow the internal deadlines.

This gives us enough time to read their application, check they have entered their qualifications correctly, write and attach their reference, and submit your application to UCAS in plenty of time.

All applications must be considered before the national deadlines, however this does not stop Universities giving out offers beforehand.





## Guidance

For 2026 entry, personal statements use a new, three-question format, replacing the previous single-page text to provide structure and clarity for applicants.

#### The questions are:

- 1) Why do you want to study this course/subject? (focus on specific motivations and interests),
- 2) How have your qualifications and studies prepared you for this course? (demonstrate relevant skills and knowledge gained from your academic work), and
- 3) What else have you done to prepare outside of education, and why is it valuable? (discuss relevant work experience, volunteering, or hobbies).



## Points to remember

- They will need a strong opening paragraph which shows excitement, understanding and reasons for studying the course.
- Their research into the course will help them link their skills, qualities and interests.
- 80% academic, 20% extra curricular. Volunteering is vital: especially for certain course like nursing.
- Be honest- they are likely to be found out if they are not!
- Don't use Al!
- It will take time- they will need to draft, redraft, and proof read.

- 3. I am applying for this course because... [1,370]
- 4. I have always been interested in... [927]
- 5. Throughout my life, I have always enjoyed... [310]
- 6. Reflecting on my educational experiences... [257]
- 7. Nursing is a very challenging and demanding [career/course]... [211]
- 8. Academically, I have always been... [168]
- 9. I have always wanted to pursue a career in... [160]
- 10. I have always been passionate about... [160]



# Encourage good habits

Get into the habit of being very critical with the number of words you use in each sentence. Once you have written something, go back and decide if each and every word you recently wrote deserves to be there.





### Decisions

Universities and colleges will review the:

- personal statement
- reference
- qualifications
- admissions test result
- interview
- portfolio
- audition

They'll get one of three decisions:

- unconditional offer
- conditional offer
- unsuccessful



### Decisions

Some institutions may give grade offers e.g. AAB, BBC or, ABC.

Some institutions may specify a particular grade in a particular subject e.g. ABC (with A in History)

Some institutions may ask for a certain number of points.

# Applicant replies

Wait for all decisions from all choices, then they can choose one:

- firm if all conditions are met, where they will be placed
- insurance usually lower conditions in case firm conditions are not met

Any other offers must be declined.

They don't have to have an insurance.

# On A Level results day

Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> August 2026 *TBC* 

Students will get an email from UCAS that morning confirming if they have either:

- met their 1<sup>st</sup> choice,
- met their insurance or
- are in clearing.

The email won't tell the students their A Level grades.

Results are available from 8am. This is to support students who may go into clearing.



### Finance

Myth 1: "You will be in debt for the rest of your life"

Myth 2: "The student loan will affect your credit score."

Myth 3: "You have to pay your tuition fees to your university yourself"



### Finance

University is an investment in yourself.

Student loans do not go on your credit file.

You repay 9% of everything earned above the (currently £26,065) threshold. They work more like a tax than a loan.



## Finance

#### Example

You have an income of £33,000 a year, meaning you get paid £2,750 each month.

#### Calculation:

£2,750 - £2,172 (your income minus the threshold) = £578

9% of £578 = £52.02

This means the amount you'd repay each month would be £52.
